Pumpkin Carving

On Tuesday, October 31st, all Homma students will be participating in a school-wide big buddy pumpkin carving activity. This activity will take place in the morning during three time slots, 9:00am-9:40am, 10:35am-11:05am and 11:10am-11:50am.

Students are invited to bring the following:

1) One small to medium sized (not too small) **CLEANED OUT** pumpkin on Monday, October 30th or Tuesday, October 31st. Please clean the pumpkin out from the **BOTTOM**. You don't need to send in the bottom of the pumpkin. Students must be able to carry their pumpkin to and from school by themselves. You may want to send a bag with them to use for transportation. Please label your child's pumpkin with their name and division number on a piece of tape.



2) A proper pumpkin carving tool (please see picture). These can be bought at most dollar stores. **NO KNIVES ARE TO BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL!** Please put child's name on the carving tools

Please label the pumpkin with your child's name and division number on a piece of tape.

Halloween Costume Guidelines

- Students come to school in their costumes, rather than getting changed at lunch. Students will still be expected to go out for recess to get some fresh air and exercise, so they should be able to move freely and play in their costumes.
- Leave masks and weapons that may go with your costumes at home. Masks can be scary, and difficult to see out of and weapons are never allowed to be brought to school, even plastic ones.
- As always, we want Halloween to be fun for ALL. When choosing costumes, a few things to keep in mind that the following are NOT Costumes:
 - RACEblack face/brown face
 - CULTUREIndigenous regalia/dreadlocks
 - RELIGIOUS FAITH ...religious figures /gods /saints
 - GENDERgender switching for humour or to mock
 - TRAUMAhangman's noose/weapons
