		Student session is 60 min about social media awareness, digital footprints and cyber bullying
		The session for staff is 90 min
		Parents' workshop is 90 min, 60 min presentation followed by 30min Q&A for social media awareness,, digital footprint and cyber bullying.
		It's \$800 for students and \$1000 for staff and parents per presentation.
