Please understand that your child's class placement has been a product of many conversations and they have been placed in a learning environment that best suits their needs.

IDENTITY AND BELONGING ACTIVITY

At Homma, we place value on the importance of creating an environment where everyone belongs and is welcomed. This has and will continue to be a big part of learning at school and is our school focus. After listening to the story "Be You" by Peter Reynolds students explored the essential questions - Who are you? And What makes you, you? They then created identity maps to share with classmates.

After this, they explored the essential question: What does it mean to belong? How do you know when you belong? And when have you know you have belonged? The responses to these essential questions were amazing and really highlighted the strength of our community.

RAINBOW CROSSWALK AT HOMMA

Over the summer, Homma became the first elementary school in the Richmond School District to have a rainbow crosswalk. The crosswalk is a visible sign that Homma welcomes and supports inclusivity for all students, families and staff and in particular members of the LGBTQ + community. This initiative started as a Social Studies project in 2019/20 in Mr. Autio's class. Mrs. Oliver, Ms.



Major, Mr. Autio, Callum H., Hayley B., Hailey C., Lily M. And Ella F. spearheaded a campaign to advocate for a rainbow crosswalk at Homma. As a result of their effort, vision and courage we were able to have one painted over the summer. We are very proud of it! Over the next few weeks all students will learn about the rainbow crosswalk and its important place as part of our community. SEPTEMBER 30 - NATIONAL DAY OF TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION AND ORANGE SHIRT DAY

This non-instructional day honors the lost children and survivors of residential schools, their families and communities. Commemoration and acknowledgement of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process. We will also be encouraging everyone to wear orange shirts on Thursday, September 29th in support of our efforts in reconciliation.

We are looking forward to being able to host a Meet the Staff evening. This year we will be inviting families to the school to connect with their child's teacher from 5:30 to 6:00 pm. STUDENT VERIFICATION PACKAGE AND SCHOOL FORMS

This week we will be sending home a package of forms that we please ask you to fill in. Each package will include an Emergency Contact Form for review and updating, information about paying for School Supplies and student agendas through the Cash On Line program, a Walking Field Trip Form, and the Consent to Receive Electronic Communications Form. When you have completed filling in all these forms, please have your child return them to the office.

STUDENT AND FAMILY AFFORDABILITY FUND

Recently, the provincial government announced a new, one time <u>Student and Family Affordability Fund</u>. This fund is designed to assist families who require financial assistance with school-related costs such as school and course fees, workbooks, specialty supplies, field trips and other school-related charges and costs. The additional funding will also be used to support school meal programs and other nutritional supports for students.

As always, all requests will be treated with dignity and your privacy will be respected. DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER

It is hard to think about rainy weather with all of the sunshine we have had this summer. We believe that time spent outside is important to student health, well being and learning. At Homma, we plan for "West Coast

Weather" and we will be outside for recess, lunch and outdoor learning in rain or shine. Please help your child feel comfortable by sending them in weather appropriate clothing such as jackets and boots. Students may also benefit from having a change of clothing and shoes at school. For our younger students, please practice putting their jackets and boots on and off. We will be outside in most weather conditions throughout the fall and winter.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES AT SCHOOL

We recognize and understand that cell phones and personal music devices are part of our lives today, and can support learning, they can also be very disruptive to learning as well. We remind students and families that these items are not permitted to be used during the school day (including recess and lunch) unless specifically requested by the teacher for an educational purpose. The school will not be responsible for missing or damaged persons electronics.

DAILY HEALTH CHECK AND STAYING HOME WHEN SICK

We are now following the Provincial Communicable Disease Guidelines for K - 12. We appreciate your support in keeping your child home when they are showing symptoms and are not feeling well. *Students should not come to school when they are sick*. Please continue to go through the Daily Health Check with your child before they come to school. If your child is not feeling well please continue to keep them home until their symptoms



have resolved. If you know your child will be absent for a range of days, please leave that information as well.

DROP OFF LANE AND PARKING LOT SAFETY

To ensure the safety of all students, please pull up as far as possible in the drop off lane when coming to school in the mornings. Please do not park in the drop off lane to bring your child into the school as it disrupts the flow of traffic. Street parking is available on Railway Ave or Brunswick Drive. At the end of the day, the drop off lane is closed to vehicles and we ask that you do not remove the parking lot chain to enter. Thank you for your support with this.
