
If you would still like to make a donation to the Poppy Fund, Homma will be continue to collect donations until Monday, November 14th.

Deborah is a dynamic teacher and experienced counsellor with over 20 years' experience in educational and mental health settings. She is passionate in taking developmental science and making it applicable to everyday life in the home and classroom. The purpose of all services is to put adults in the driver's seat by making sense of kids from the inside out.

From everyday questions to complex problems, strategies for making headway with a child or teen is grounded in a rich developmental framework. Deborah will be sharing research and information about childhood anxiety, the importance of play and building resiliency. November 16th in the Homma Gym for Div. 4-12 and Div. 16-23

The Ocean Wise Sea Dome is a new immersive ocean adventure that brings marine magic to communities everywhere. The portable, inflatable six-metre dome projects 360-degree 4K cinematic footage showing connections between ocean health, climate change, and daily life. Youth will see the Arctic to view changes in sea ice, to tropical reefs to assess impacts of ocean acidification, and to BC's rivers to learn how salmon habitats can be preserved.



Richmond School District 38 is excited to welcome kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2018, turning 5 in 2023. These children will begin kindergarten in September 2023. Online registration opens on November 1, 2022. Please visit our website http://www.sd38.bc.ca/kindergarten for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates and FAQs.

Families are encouraged to register any time during the Priority 1 registration period (November – January) for the best chance at attending their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 3, 2023.

Instead of in person information evenings this year, we have posted short videos that provide our new parents with information about the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options – Early French Immersion and Montessori. DROP OFF LANE AND PARKING LOT SAFETY
