Libraries have changed over the past few years and the way the space is being used has evolved with these changes. Libraries continue to be the hub of a school community where literacy is a primary focus. School libraries have become rich environements, where students can engage in experiences that push them beyond book reading and signing out books. Moving forward into the fall, there will be an opportunity for PAC to provide financial support to cover costs for furniture needed for flexible learning. Library learning commons, books are pushed out to walls so there is open space in the middle. Books are on caster wheels so things can be pushed out of the way. McNeely, Mitchell, Blundell, Garden City have had renovations recently. Cozy and innovative seating. Better ways to display resources. More integrated pieces of technology is promoting equity so all students have access to new technologies.

Lots of interesting furniture and different materials to make the LLC more inviting.

Carole: Overarching inquiry question: How do we accommodate our space for increased student engagement? The whole project will take more than 1 year. Canvassed students and other teachers for their ideas.

Ingrid: Promote literacy and reading. Literacy is front and center of the project. Examples of things that happened in the library today: Kids can buddy read; Small groups working in aisles. 1:1 conferences with kids researching Heritage Fair and students audio recording themselves for a podcast. Want to shrink current circulation desk.

Maker space lab in the back of the library is currently being gutted and transformed.

Derek: \$30,000 grant from the school district doesn't get us a lot. The furniture is very costly and asking for PAC to support.

Question from Miranda: "will there continue to be a quiet space in the library?". Answer is yes.

Question from Corrine "Who will project manage the project?" Answer: Carpentry Team from the school board will be doing work with consultation with librarians, Derek and school board. Creating a space which has longevity.

Question from Jen: "Do we have an estimated cost of furniture?". Answer: Tables \$585 each. Only 1 company which is approved by school district to provide the furniture. Estimating \$10,000-20,000.

Question from Anna: What is the timeline for this project? Answer: Fall of coming school year in 2023 will be the projected start date. Carpentry covered by grant and furniture should be ordered in the fall to time for Spring reopen.

Spring Fair will be more low key this year than in previous years due to low volunteer engagement and changes to school board rules regarding inflatables etc. <br> Anna: Carnival was a big project and hasn't been run since 2019. Whatever happens next will not be the same. Inflatables are no longer allowed from parent groups. Plus there is a new focus on inclusion and sustainability. We are just under 3 months away and a lot of work/planning needs to be done. <br> - Fundraising (West Coast Seeds pick up on Thursday after school, 74CO5) <br> Anna: Fundraiser feedback. Corrine: We are on hold for a bit as orders have been down. Freezie sales will hopefully happen in the spring. We will hold off on pub night and car wash for now due to fear of fundraising fatigue. <br> Question from Sharmila: Are we doing hanging baskets this year? Answer: No, based on low orders from Growing Smiles last year. <br> - Communication and community engagement (Facebook community group and Kindergarten Welcome Package) <br> Linda: We want to put 1-2 pages into the Welcome to Kindergarten Package. To Email admin in April to get it in the pack for May. <br> Comments: Sue Ann: Brain storming idea. Can we ask for a French consultant position to be involved with planning of the spring fair?
