7:15 to 7:30 PM	<p>Current Budget Review and Plans for 2023-2024 Budget</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review of our current budget • No events during COVID so we are in good financial position and have been conservative with spending the last couple of years. Try to make sure we have enough money in the bank to cover following years expenses if no fundraising was done. • Fiscal year end May 31, 2023. Estimated actuals until the end of the month and then items for reconciliation. • Gaming fund received from the government for each student ~\$10,000/year and needs to be specifically spent on students. Types of spending include year book, snacks for Sports Day, Fine Arts (artist in residence), Literacy Support, \$1000 for sports equipment (recess and lunch equipment), online safety workshops, Mental Health and sexual health workshops, Grade 7 Farewell and Garden. Need to spend gaming grant every 3 years or it disappears. • Operating Fund (our fundraising income). Biggest fundraising event is Hot Lunch program~ \$10-11,000/year. • Some community events are not big money makers such as Bingo Night. Halloween and Craft Fair were not hosted this year due to lack of volunteers. • Previous years Fair raised \$4,000-\$6,000. Biggest expense this year is games rental from Party Works. • Silent Auctions from a lot of Steveston Businesses, Cake Walk and all food vendors will give kick back to the PAC. • Budget for Capital Aquisitions. Perhaps sound system? As per admin. • Teachers grant is \$300 each classroom teacher and \$200 for resource teachers/Librarians. The fund is roughly 60% used and money left over gets rolled over for next year. • In the past Teacher Appreciation Lunch (~51 staff) was ordered due to COVID restrictions. This year it is scheduled for Jun 21, 2023. \$2000 budget was to order lunch out. There is interest in going back to pot luck style as last years vendor was disappointing with making food in time and many orders missed. • Discretionary fund was spent this year on the Welcome Back to School coffee and muffins. • McMath student scholarship (3 x \$250) for former Homma students. All of the other catchment schools give these scholarships as well. 	Anna Reithmeier On behalf of Marcie Beggs

- Parent education workshops and Grade 6/7 outdoor ed (PAC funded the buses for Outdoor Ed camp).
- Artist in Residence (Drumming, Bollywood dancing were the main activities this year)
- **Question:** Beth asked if next year's budget includes inflation. Anna answered No.
- -Grade 7 Farewell needs more money based on higher number of students this year and need more than \$500 to cover lunch and balloons and backdrops as per admin.
- -Corrine suggested to collapse items for fundraising into 1 line item. Ideas for next year include Pub Night & Car Wash. Perhaps we could change fundraising more towards community events? Derek said we need to be aware of fundraising fatigue for some families who can't afford it. Concerns all around about liability/safety for students and liability for property damage if cars get damaged by students (scratches etc.)
- -Sue Ann suggested that if we have extra, we can subsidize Community events. Anna commented- we put on Bingo night which was usually a wash and not a big money maker, same as the Halloween Dance. All events to build community, without the intention of being big fundraisers.
- Suggestion of moving Athletics to 1 line item? However it was ascertained that for gaming grant reasons we usually split into 2 items as there is a maximum on the spend for this from the gaming grant.
- Admin has asked PAC to help fund the furniture for the Library Commons Project which Derek has budgeted up to \$30,000. \$10,000 set aside for this. \$20,000 fundraising goal. District grant approved for \$30,000 but this cost goes towards the structure of the new library and would be an empty library if only \$30,000 were spent. We are in the queue for timeline of starting in fall of 2023. However this is subject to change.
- Admin thinks artists in Residences costs are higher than initially expected. Karima Essa (Bollywood Dancing) planning a workshop for next year again.
- **Consensus to:**
- **Increase artist in residence/Fine arts programming to \$8,500.**
- **Increase budget for library commons project to \$20,000.**
- **Increase Grade 7 farewell budget to \$2,000 (lunch for students only, balloons and backgrounds, cookies, carnations, flowers etc.).**
- **Lower Teacher appreciation lunch to \$1,000 as COVID restrictions lifted and can bring back potluck style.**
- **Increase McMath scholarship amounts for 2 x \$500 (instead of 3 x \$250).**
- Derek matches the PAC sports equipment amounts, also tries to focus on not main stream sports (e.g., curling event this year, frisbees, spike ball etc.).
- Thanks Marcie and Anna for puttingtogether the budget!
- Marcie has put money we won't spend until November in a term deposit to gain ~\$950 interest.
