Extracirricular sports equipment increased from $\$ 1,000$ to $\$ 2,500$. <br> -Updated Grade 7 farewell budget from $\$ 500$ to $\$ 2,000$ | Marcie Beggs |


|  | -\$3,937 gaming fund being carried over to next year. Can carry over for 3 years. <br> - $\$ 55,520$ in operating account <br> -\$6,000 earned from Spring Fair. Projected \$5,000 for next years Spring Fair. <br> -Capital Acquisitions allocated to new sound system (left same amount at $\$ 5,000$ ) <br> -Reduced budget for Teacher's Lunch from \$500 to \$200 based on bringing back parent potluck lunch as previous years were purchased due to COVID restrictions. <br> -Increased McMath scholarships to \$1,000 from \$750. Still split into 3 scholarships. <br> -Library learning commons grant support updated to \$20,000 <br> -Miranda had a comment to see if there was room to update \$500 scholarship to 3 students? Anna replied and said she contacted McMath VP but didn't receive a reply if they preferred $\$ 1000$ split into 2 scholarships or split into 3? Anna researched last year with other catchment schools and we were amongst some of the highest. <br> Option for $\$ 1200$ for ( $3 x \$ 400$ ) or $\$ 1500(3 x \$ 500)$. <br> -Derek has ordered picnic tables and these have arrived. <br> - Call for vote on the budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 <br> Corrine made a motion to approve budget; Beth seconded. <br> Motion will carry as more than $50 \%$ of voters agreed. |  |

Take over garden teachers room? <br> -Anna commented: Prize room was well gate kept, perhaps a reason line was so long outside. <br> -Penny commented: All volunteers said parents/kids were happy. <br> -Feedback for food: Lower volume of food ordered/sold compared to last year. We did get $\$ 500$ donation for the school from Cultivate Food Truck. <br> -Corrine commented: Should move food truck to back to consolidate food and give more visibility. <br> -Approximately \$6,000 was raised from the Fair. <br> -Gelato: \$40 kickback. Promised 50 cents a cup back. <br> -Cotton Cand: \$337 kickback <br> -Cultivate Food Truck: \$500 kickback. <br> -Concession stand did well. <br> -Beth commented: etransfer for silent auction could have been more streamlined. We now know we can get etransfer to PAC account now and should be smoother going forward. <br> -Square tap option explored, but seemed like a lot of money as they want fee and portion of service. <br> -Corrine commented: If we hired a band/had a beer garden with City of Richmond grant money instead of tickets for games, this might help with the volunteer situation. | Meeting Chair |

We must revisit this next year with regards to the details MUCH earlier for planning purposes. <br> -Marcie: Enjoyed the fishing game and thanks for the mom who painted it. <br> - PAC Meetings for new school year discussion (ex. day and time preferences) <br> -Meetings need to be in partnership with admin staff. We need to host meetings to meet bylaws and get Gaming grant. <br> -We currently do not host meetings in December/March. Our AGM is in May. <br> -Beth commented: 630pm families are eating and need to go to bed. Is it possible to alternate times/days? <br> -Derek: Would not be willing to change meeting to 830-10pm meeting. Suggested a day time meeting, or moving to 4 pm ? <br> -Jarrod: Mentioned having PAC meeting right after morning bell. <br> -Derek said at previous schools when PACS would switch meeting times they would get a different group of parents at the day time meetings vs night time meetings. Derek said that the Homma challenge would be to find space physically with empty rooms for daytime meetings. <br> -Admin very busy at 9am and can be dealing with issues that come up on the fly. Staff shortages due to sick calls etc. <br> -Admin stated 630pm time works best or 4pm, perhaps 930am start, but day time meetings need to be virtual due to lack of physical space. <br> -Admin reiterated day time meetings too hard based on workload. <br> -Admin said 530pm would work. <br> -Beth commented rotating day would help. <br> - Staff Appreciation Lunch Reminder (June 21) <br> - Freezy Friday <br> -Corrine: We made over $\$ 1,000$ for 2 Freezy Fridays. We will try to sell the $\sim 200$ freezy's we have left on the last day of school. Need 4 volunteers. <br> -Photo day went well. Still awaiting cheque from photographer. <br> - RDPA Minutes <br> -Jarrod: Playgrounds and fundraising came up a lot. Takeaway message as PACS are all doing the same things. Perhaps we can buy 10,000 freezies and save money. Anna: we used to have a RDPA rep, but this position was unfilled at Homma.
