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| 7:15 to <br> $7: 30$ PM | Treasurer's Report <br> Budget update <br> Marcie to answer questions about last year's financials in black. <br> Miranda to give updates on this year's financials in red. Sheets handed <br> out to each table. <br> Marcie: <br> Gaming income based on student per head based on things which <br> directly benefit the students such as comic books (not educational); <br> snacks for Sports Day etc.) \$5800 + 10000 = ~ $\$ 16,000$. We look to <br> admin and teachers on how to best use those funds. For example, <br> sports equipment, funding the garden and the Grade 7 farewell. <br> We are starting the gaming fund this year with \$7,178. <br> The Operating account is funded by different fundraising activities. We <br> have an active PAC. \$11,000 earned last year from Hot Lunch days <br> (Pizza; DQ; Sushi); \$2200 (Purdy's) etc. <br> Some events are not meant to make money and are put on by the PAC <br> as community building events. Examples are Bingo night or the Craft <br> fair. | Miranda Duffy and <br> Marcie Beggs |


|  | Derek: Any suggestions brought forth need to be supported by <br> teachers/admin and benefit all students. <br> Miranda: (Red ink page) <br> - Almost \$18,000 in gaming fund. <br> -Increase sports equipment from \$1000 to \$2500. Derek commented <br> that all cost of balls have gone up substantially (soccer balls; rubber <br> balls; volleyballs). Outdoor equipment gets lost or kicked on the roof, <br> left outside, so they need to get replaced often. Approved in May <br> budget. <br> -Increased Grade 7 farewell budget due to large number of students <br> graduating. <br> -Projected balance for gaming fund \$3,683. <br>  <br> - Questions |  |
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| Beth asked: Where is Homma on the district's playground waitlist? <br> Corrine answered: We are likely 4-5 years on the waitlist. She emailed <br> the School district about the broken spiral slide and the school district <br> replied that the slide was irreplaceable. Anna commented: Playground <br> section which is pink with tape is from the 1990's. Swing, slide and <br> spider web section of the playground was new 7 years ago and was <br> funded by the PAC and we raised ~\$70,000 with volunteer parents <br> installing it. Ginny commented that most playground equipment <br> installation needs to be done by the companies we purchase it from, <br> and can be an added cost. <br> Corrine: Do we have updated quotes for the library commons project? <br> Derek answered: No. We are hoping for a January start on construction. <br> We are a little behind schedule and new carpenters are being hired. <br> Homma received a \$30,000 grant to renovate the library, but is asking <br> the PAC to fund \$20,000-\$30,000 for furniture. |  |  |


|  | will send an email to old teachers and PAC to see if we can find <br> answers. <br> Miranda: Are there any changes to numbers we want to consider <br> today? None raised. <br> Ginny: Leadership fund for Grade 5/6/7 students to celebrate volunteer <br> work at the end of the year (crossing guard; lunch monitor; office <br> monitor; library monitor; recess monitor; morning announcement). <br> Won't tell them until the end of the year to promote intrinsic <br> motivation. Ginny plans to reward them with a pizza <br> party/drinks/certificates. Approximately 209 students (not including <br> Grade 4 students) \$1500 is the suggested budget and Ginny will <br> organize this pizza/celebration. <br> Motion suggested by Anna and seconded by Corrine for \$1500 <br> allocated to leadership celebration. Motion carried and voted by <br> majority. <br> Question from Jeff: Asked if sports equipment spending was spent from <br> last year. Marcie answered that they amalgamated the 2 sports <br> equipment line items and increased sports equipment fund by \$500 <br> from last year. <br> Derek: We will need to replace jerseys in the future, but it wasn't in <br> 2023/24 academic year budget. |  |

Propose delivery for Wed., Dec 6. <br> Anna: Can have meetings off cycle of the PAC meetings to plan larger <br> events. <br> Marcie: Halloween dance. Haunted Hallway was very popular. Good <br> community building and one of her daughter's fondest memories of <br> Homma. |  |
