Comments/questions are in BLUE. <br> - Library Learning Commons Update <br> Derek: We have been eagerly waiting the start date for construction on the Library Learning Commons project. Due to staff shortages, it looks like the work will begin during Spring Break. We have met with the carpenters and district maintenance staff to discuss and finalize plans. We are excited about this work beginning shortly. <br> Derek: The original furniture order went in, but the original supplier messed up the costing and would not honor the original quote so we will go with another company and want to place the new order as soon as possible. <br> Miranda asked: Were you able to order all the items we originally planned to? Derek answered: Yes but may need to scale back the order slightly. <br> Jen typed in chat: Just wanted to ask for the library commons furniture if the cost increased with this new supplier? <br> Derek answered: Original supplier quoted $\$ 15,000-\$ 16,000$ but after they messed up, the new quote was $\$ 27,000$. |  | - Care for Place, Others and Self <br> Care for Self, Care for Others, Care for Place <br> At Homma we have been discussing the importance of having common <br> language in the school around how we are with each other. Homma has <br> a strong culture of care and community, and we want to continue to <br> build on this. By having a common language students know what is <br> expected of them and we will also be able to highlight the great things <br> that go on in the school. <br> Prior to Covid, there was a lot of work that went into helping students <br> learn the H.A.W.K.S acronym which stands for helpful, accountable, we <br> not me, kind and safe. In surveying students and staff we have learned <br> that this acronym is no longer part of the culture of the school and <br> there is a general feeling that it is time to shift the common language to <br> something that is more inclusive. <br> Staff have expressed interest in moving to the use of Care for Self, Care <br> for Others and Care for Place. This language would be more open and <br> provide greater flexibility for learning. It also aligns with the First People <br> Principles of Learning and district strategic plan priority 2 - Equity and <br> Inclusion. At a recent assembly we spent time working with our <br> students to learn about care for place. Students shared many examples <br> of how they could care for Homma, Steveston, Richmond and planet <br> Earth. We will continue to build this common language with our <br> students and staff and will involve Homma families in the learning. You <br> will start to hear students sharing this common language with you as <br> they learn more about it. |  |
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|  | Recently, Ms. Regan invited the Ocean Wise Sea Dome to Homma, which is an immersive ocean adventure that brings marine magic to communities everywhere. The Sea Dome is a portable, inflatable sixmetre dome that projects 360 -degree 4 K cinematic footage showing connections between ocean health, climate change, and daily life. The primary students that work with Ms. Regan in the garden were able to see the Arctic to view changes in sea ice, to tropical reefs to assess impacts of ocean acidification, and to BC's rivers to learn how salmon habitats can be preserved. A huge thank you to Ms. Regan! <br> - Family Bingo Night <br> A huge thank you to the PAC for a fun community event! It was very well attended and a great opportunity for families to come together. Ginny thanked PAC for Bingo night, which was fun and well attended. <br> - Lion Dance <br> Recently, Ms. Yau and Mr. Cherry helped organize some dancers to come and perform the Lion Dance for our students in anticipation of Lunar New Year. Overall, the students' engagement was high, and the teachers reported that their students really enjoyed the presentation. The students especially enjoyed the interaction at the end with the Lion Dancers, as they allowed the students and staff to touch the costumes as they paraded along the sides of the gym, and the live drumming was also a hit! <br> Ginny said the staff and student feedback about the Lion Dance Fri Feb $9^{\text {th }}$ was positive. <br> - History of Motown <br> We had the privilege to welcome Krystle Dos Santos and her 4-piece band, who took us back in time to the peak of Motown Music from the late 1950s to 1980s. Her medleys of hits by The Supremes, Stevie Wonder, the Temptations and the Jackson 5 had us singing and dancing along. The students learned interesting facts about these key artists and about the historical and significant impact that Motown music has had on contemporary soul music today. <br> Ginny said the staff feedback about History of Motown (Tues Feb 13) was positive and in celebration of Black History month. Students and staff had a great time dancing/singing along. <br> - Upcoming Parent night about Outdoor Ed <br> This Thursday, February 22, at 6:00 pm we will be having a parent meeting to talk about our upcoming fall Outdoor Education trip to Camp Jubilee. This continues to be true despite letters of appeal. | Miranda Duffy |


|  | Gaming Account update: <br> The gaming grant carried over from last year was \$7,178. With <br> input from Marcie, she suggested that we spend as much of the <br> gaming fund as possible and Miranda was able to assign our <br> Gaming account budget dollars down to \$28 remaining. <br> Operating Account Update: <br> The goal every year is to have enough in this fund that if we did <br> no fundraising for a year, we could pay for our expenses for the <br> next academic year with our current balance. This is the fund <br> where most of the PAC spending comes from (For example Grade <br> 7 yearbook, Fun Day, Online safety workshops, Mental health <br> workshops etc.). If we raised no money at the spring fair, we will <br> still have 7/8 of our yearly spending handled for the next school <br> year. <br> Anna commented: We always have fundraisers like Hot Lunch so <br> it is unlikely we will have \$0 income. Miranda agrees. <br> Miranda: We projected ~\$7,000 income from hot lunch, so this <br> will cover a lot of our expenses for this year. 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|  | money was left on June $30^{\text {th }}$ it would get rolled back to the district. <br> Ginny asked about \$175 to cover the cost of the Maple Man as she couldn't see it in the budget? Miranda said it was missing and that we voted on supporting this in the November meeting. It will be added to the budget now. <br> Ginny said that the gym equipment money has been spent in full. <br> Anna commented that this budget was not shared with the school community prior to this meeting. Miranda said she discussed this with Barb and it was discussed that budget information is supposed to be shared every meeting. Anna commented that we should share where things are at with the gaming grant and what items of the budget we will be voting on for the next meeting. Jarrod suggested we will put it on the agenda to let people know what we will be voting for at the April Meeting. Miranda is very keen on trying to get more parent voices out to vote and comment on the budget in April. <br> Derek suggested for the April meeting agenda to put out what we will be voting for to encourage more parent turn out. <br> Derek is asking for a copy of the budget for the admin and office staff after the PAC meetings to be able to purchase things. Miranda agreed to send a copy to them. <br> Miranda says the budget is a living document and gets updated almost daily. Miranda will add the missing line item for Maple Man (\$175) which had been voted on and approved at our November PAC meeting. She will also add line items for the Lion Dance and the History of Motown to the budget, to be voted on at the April meeting. <br> Given that we only have 4 non-PAC Executive members in attendance, we did not feel comfortable voting on budget changes tonight even though we technically met quorum with 8 parents in attendance. <br> - Questions <br> No additional questions were asked. |  |

Penny agreed to <br> this. <br> Jen asked if there were any complaints around a lack of tickets <br> around Bingo night and about not being able to reserve tickets? <br> Jarrod and Penny said there were no complaints about the tickets <br> selling out this year. <br> - Spring Event Discussion / Brainstorming |  |
