	<p>singing, reading Flanders Fields, etc. Due to gym capacity, we will only be able to accommodate students and staff.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <b>Hip Hop Jess Dance Programming – December 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15 &amp; 16 (Ginny).</b>  Lessons will be in a Day 1/Day 2 rotation (English classes on one day and French classes on the other day – there are 2 different instructors and only one speaks French). On December 15 and 16, it will be the dress rehearsals and afternoon performance. The English group’s dress rehearsal and performance on one day and the French group’s dress rehearsal and performance on the other day. </li> </ul> <p><b>Budget items/questions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li> Can we see about increasing the Garden budget – sharing Sarah Regan’s budget (Ginny)  Yearly basic upkeep is about \$1500. This includes: soil (\$400), garden tools and supplies (\$500), plants (\$300), Seed Starting equipment (\$200), lending library (\$100).  Yearly teacher consumables is about \$1000. This includes basic school supplies, groceries, and special student projects.  New initiatives (or initiatives that aren’t annual) include, but are not limited to:  Replacing mulch, adding shelving to the greenhouse, repairing the bug hotel and music wall, updating the mud kitchen, replacing trees that didn’t survive on the berm, replacing the wooden picnic tables that will be at the end of their life soon, purchasing new teaching resources such as storybooks and small loose parts), etc.  Mme Regan does a great job applying for grants every year, which she also uses to offset the above expenses.  We are wondering if it would be possible to add additional funds in the Garden line – Instead of \$2150 = \$2300? </li> <li> Is PAC willing to subsidize the Hip Hop Dance lessons? (Ginny)  Final cost = \$11,877.40 = \$23.75 per student = each student gets 4 lessons, one rehearsal, one performance. </li> </ol> <p>At a later date:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li> If we do the Saleema Noon workshops, would the PAC be willing to help with the costs for the school – teachers are hoping for in-person workshops and/or access to the online lessons. </li> </ol>

## September into October:

We started the 2025-26 school year with:

- \$8,078.84 in our contingency fund
- \$47,504.71 in Operating funds, and
- \$11,238.47 in our Gaming Account.

As mentioned in the September Report, we are still waiting to receive some final invoices for the work that was done in the summer of 2024 to revitalize our Library Commons. These were funds that the PAC had committed to the Library in our 2023-24 budget.

### Gaming

On September 26<sup>th</sup>, the Community Gaming Grants Branch notified us that our application for a Gaming grant had been successful. We received our grant of \$10,720 on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, which brings the current balance of our Gaming account to \$21,856.47.

### Fundraising

Jeff Anthony and Jodie Weiler have our Hot Lunch Program up and running. We have offered two Hot Lunch dates so far, plus this coming Friday's Hot Lunch offering from Takeya Sushi. We continue to offer cash-based concession sales of Hot Lunch as an option for families.

We also held a Homma Social Night on October 3<sup>rd</sup> at Lavash Seaside Grill in Steveston Village. We made \$544 on ticket sales, and \$149 from the 50/50 draw, for a total of \$693. Congratulations to Madeleine Wareing and Joanne Belda on their first event!

### Upcoming Events

Niki Boileau is leading the coordination of our Homma Hallowe'en Family Dance, which takes place this year on October 29<sup>th</sup> from 6-8 pm in the Homma Gym. We hold the dance primarily for fun and to build community at Homma.
